Term of prospective contract: Purchase new pump for the 2nd Source Pump Station which is the primary source of water for the City of Bloomfield during Bloomfield Irrigation District Ditch down time.

 - Accept and inspect pump at Sulzer
 - Deliver pump to site
- IV. Explanation for the justification of the procurement including a description of the emergency conditions requiring use of emergency procurement and the practicable competition utilized in compliance with NMSA 1978, Section 13-1-127.

On September 5, 2023 the Bloomfield Irrigation Ditch had a ditch break and had to be shut off. The Bloomfield Irrigation Ditch is the primary supplier of drinking water to the residents of the City of Bloomfield. The Bloomfield Irrigation Ditch fills the City's reservoir which has a 28 supply of water. The estimated time for the ditch repair was 4-6 weeks so the City began operating the 2nd Source to supply water to the City's water plant and to the reservoir. 2nd Source normally operates nightly for a few hours to top off the reservoir if necessary, however during this time, it has operated 24/7 until the ditch is repaired and the reservoir is filled.

The City has 3 pumps that are rotated to operate the 2nd Source. All 3 pumps are over 15 years old and all have been rebuilt at least 2 times each. Since the ditch break, 2nd source has been pumping 24/7 and one pump has stopped working completely and a 2nd pump works intermittently. Therefore, we hereby request a new pump be purchased immediately to ensure a constant water supply to the City.

V. Describe what measures are being taken to minimize the duration and effect of this particular emergency procurement (for example: is the emergency only in place until a competitive process can be completed, etc.).

When the ditch is repaired and the turbidity in it is low enough, the City will be able to have another source of water for treatment.

VI. Describe what measures the Agency will take in the future to prevent/mitigate use of an emergency procurement under similar circumstances.

The City is tracking pump run time hours and implementing a new maintenance plan to have the pumps rebuilt on a set schedule to help prevent unscheduled down time. The City is also researching adding an additional settling pond, increasing the size of our existing pond (2nd source) and adding baffles to slow the flow of water to help with turbidity.
